HELPFUL INFORMATION ABOUT GUILD COMMITTEES

Each Greensboro Symphony committee is governed by a council. The four councils are Education, Fundraising, Marketing and Operations. It is helpful to know what each committee does.

Education Council Committees:

Adult Outreach assists the Greensboro Symphony in providing ensemble concerts for senior citizens throughout the community. It provides educational programs preceding the Masterworks concerts.

Elementary Student Concerts Committee assists in staging a concert by the Greensboro Symphony Orchestra for third and fourth grade students in the greater Greensboro area. Advance educational materials are distributed to the schools to prepare the children for the concerts.

Music in the Middle Committee assists in staging a concert for seventh grade students. Advance educational materials are given to core curriculum teachers to prepare the students for the concerts.

Women's Chorus represents and promotes the Greensboro Symphony Guild and Greensboro Symphony Orchestra with performances. The chorus selects its conductor and accompanist. Membership in the chorus is open to all Guild members.

Fund Raising Council Committees:

These committees are responsible for all activities associated with their respective fund raising efforts and include the Car Raffle, The Golf/Tennis Classic, Name that Tune (a collaborative effort with the Greensboro Symphony Orchestra Board of Directors), the Presentation Ball, and the Scavenger Hunt.

Marketing Council Committees:

The Advocacy and Community Relations Committee creates and promotes public awareness of Guild activities.

The Cookbook Committee markets and promotes "Recipes of Note."

The Newsletter Editors work closely with the Guild president to publish newsletters for the general membership.

The Publicity Committee publicizes the Greensboro Symphony Guild through the media by reporting the activities of the Guild.

Website Committee members are responsible for maintaining the Guild's website, listing projects and activities of the Guild. Relevant photos and news items are posted throughout the year.

Operations Council Committees:

The Corresponding Secretary sends notes and cards to Guild members in case of illness, bereavement or births. She is also responsible for acknowledging receipt and thanking donors or their contributions to the Education Fund, the Endowment and the Greensboro Symphony Guild.

The Historian serves as a repository of historical records of the Greensboro Symphony Guild.

The Hospitality Committees make arrangements for Guild meetings, including location and refreshments.

Membership Committee members are responsible for issuing invitations to prospective members and providing social and orientation events for new members in the fall and spring.

The members of the Nominations/Awards Committee prepare a slate of Executive Officers which are presented to the Guild at a general meeting. It also selects Guild Award recipients.

Orchestra Support Committee members coordinate dinners for the orchestra members during rehearsals.

The Parliamentarian provides guidance in proper procedure for conducting meetings.

The Program Committee invites guest artists and makes arrangements for their performances at general meetings.

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
