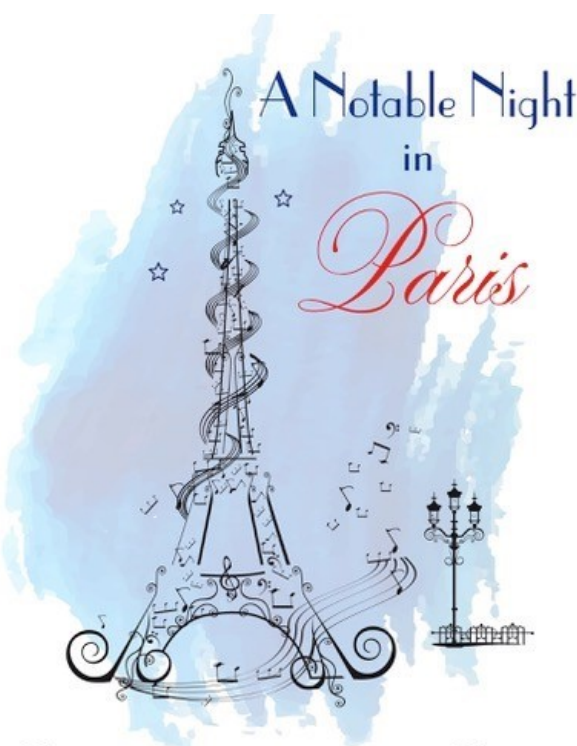

Prior to the concert, the GSO generates resource materials to prepare the students for the concert experience.

The Guild provides \$6000 annually to partially underwrite this innovative program. 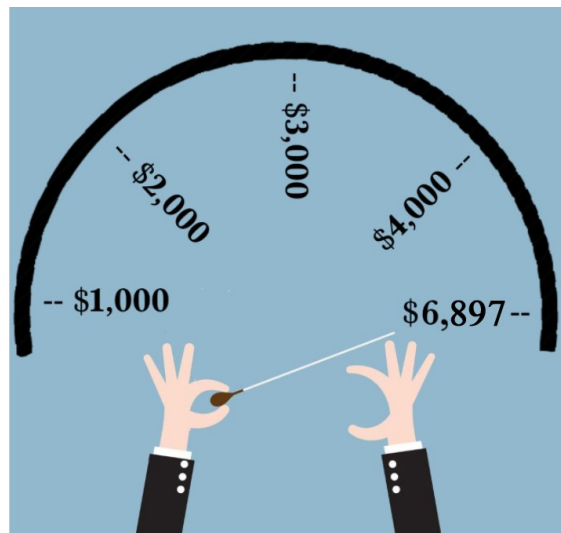
