## GSYO Performances Thrill the Audience

A fantastic Winter Concert was performed at Dana Auditorium on Sunday, March 12<sup>th</sup> by the three divisions of the Greensboro Symphony Youth Orchestra—the Youth Camerata, Youth Philharmonic and Youth Orchestra. A large audience enthusiastically applauded all groups and gave the Youth Orchestra a standing ovation with two curtain calls.

What does it take to produce this concert? For starters, dedicated leaders such as Nate Beversluis, Music Director; Peter Zlotnick, Education Manager; Colleen Chenail and Lee Ritchie, Youth Philharmonic Conductors; and Rachel Watson, Youth Camerata Conductor. All, with the exception of Rachel, are members of Greensboro Symphony Orchestra. Rachel is a high school teacher who recently participated in the Guild's high school mentorship program. In addition, ten instrument specific sectional rehearsal coaches were involved, along with three ensemble rehearsal conductors. Many of these very talented people are also members of the GSO. As well, there are three people on the production staff for the actual concerts.
