50th Anniversary Luncheon

A festive luncheon kicked off the Guild's 50th Anniversary Celebration on May 7th at Greensboro Country Club. The event drew 188 Guild members, guests and dignitaries from around Greensboro. A 1960s theme, carried out in the menu, decor and apparel of many attendees, added to the excitement.

Those present included 32 of the Guild's Past-Presidents and five of the seven Charter members who have belonged to the Guild since it was formed in 1964. Three Honorary Members were also present, including **Barbara Cone**, the Guild's first President. The Honorable A. Robinson "Robby" Hassell, son of former Guild President, **Jeanne Hassell**, attended. Hassell presented a



The close-out sale, a new addition this year, was held from 2:00 to 3:30 p.m. For \$20 per person, shoppers could enter and exit as many times as they wanted, taking whatever merchandise they could haul away. This "cash and carry" sale raised an additional \$440!
