The 10th anniversary of the Guild was marked by a Ball held at Sedgfield Manor House in September 1973. Dr. and Mrs. Peter Young (she was Guild President) and Mr. and Mrs. Howard Sprock (she was Ball Chairman) greeted guests at the door. A quartet from the youth orchestra provided music as guests arrived and enjoyed "a buffet supper amid a setting of magnolias, candles in hurricane globes and hanging baskets of greenery".

After dinner, about 500 guests including State and community leaders, as well as Guild members and their spouses, danced the night away to the music of Bobby Bair and his orchestra.

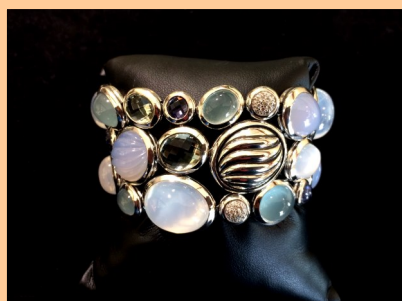
Note Cards

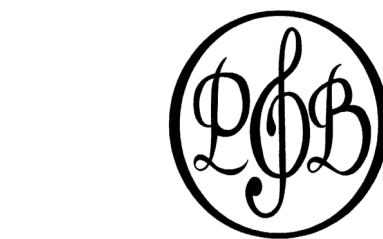
