co-ordination effort extraordinaire. Betsy also served as a Vice-Chair for Corporate Sponsorships in the 2016-17 Guild year.

A native of Greenville, South Carolina, Betsy is a graduate of Illinois Wesleyan University with a degree in Musical Theatre. She and her husband Philip moved to Greensboro from New York City in 2009. They have 2 sons, both born in Greensboro, the first after she had been in Greensboro for two weeks. They are members of St. Pius X Catholic Church.

While in New York City, Betsy was a professional actress from 2000 to 2009, served as a worldwide USO entertainer from 2001 to 2004 and did work with Vogue magazine, Revlon, Bear Stearns and as a celebrity dog walker. She served as the Director of Client Hospitality for Guggenheim Partners from 2004-2009. New York's loss was Greensboro's gain.

After moving to Greensboro, Betsy joined the Junior League, serving on their Board of Directors from 2009 to 2013. She also became a member of Project Greenway from 2011 to 2012 and served on the Friends of Center City Park Steering Committee from 2011 to 2013. She is a lifetime member of the Future Fund of the Community Foundation. Betsy joined the GSO Board in 2013 and still serves as a board member. She chaired "Name that Tune" for GSO for both the 2014 and 2015 years where she dramatically expanded the vision of the event and more than doubled the attendance and amount of net revenue generated for the orchestra. Many new, young professionals were secured through her efforts and she helped put a new face on the symphony. Lisa Crawford, our orchestra President, describes Betsy as having "worked tirelessly for the orchestra and has done this with enthusiasm, creativity and style. She is one of a kind!"


